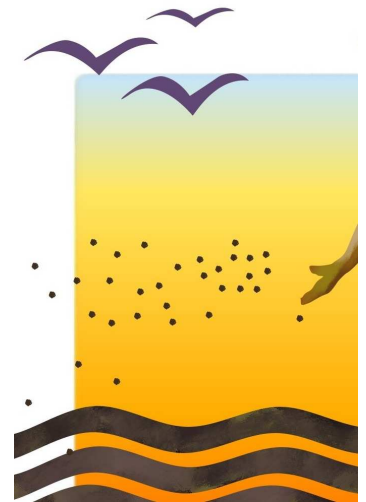


“We plough the fields and scatter

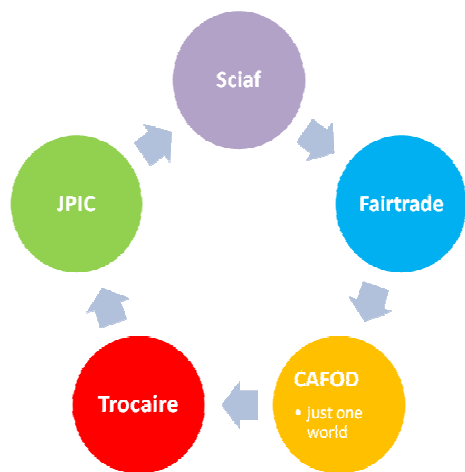

Margaret Lee and I recently attended the AGM of the CRS (Teresa was away that weekend). The main speaker was Gerry Mulligan CSSR on the church's outreach to people today. He shared about his experience at the John Paul II Center in Middlesbrough, where he worked for some years. His main point was that we need to go out to meet people where they are Because so few are coming to church. There was good sharing of people's experiences at the end of the talk.

The revised statutes were approved CRS, with a reduction of the number serving on the executive committee. Information was shared about the work of the various sub-groups: Justice and Peace, Forum against Human Trafficking, Vocation Forum and a new group set up on Pastoral / Spiritual Care in Later Life.
